COURSE OVERVIEW

In this course, students will build on the basic foundation from Spanish 1. They will learn new grammar structures and vocabulary. In Spanish 2, students will continue their journey to communicate and develop their skill sets in Spanish by:

- 1. learning new thematic vocabulary
- 2. practicing structure and vocabulary through speech
- 3. listening carefully for information in an oral format
- 4. communicating thoughts and ideas in written form (ie: mainly through dialogues)
- 5. reading books in Spanish for information/enjoyment and discussion
- 6. an introduction of new grammar patterns in Spanish to communicate in the past, the present and the future.
- 7. being introduces to Hispanic cultures and communities.

REQUIREMENTS:

Willingness and desire to learn a new language. Successful completion of Spanish 1, or instructor approval.

GRADING POLICY:

The grading scale used is the school wide scale found in the student handbook.

The semester final grade is calculated with the following weights: Semester Work: 80% Final Exam 20%

The semester work is comprised of Summative assessments and completion of practice activities. These also will be weighted as follows:

Summative assessments: 90% Practice activities 10%

ASSESSMENTS:

Formative Assessments will be used throughout the course. Formative Assessments will provide FEEDBACK to the student, but will NOT be placed in the grade book.

Summative Assessments will include a variety of skills and will include the following:

Reading proficiency (ability to gather information from a text) Writing proficiency (ability to communicate effectively on a topic) Listening comprehension (ability to decode main ideas from an audio source) Speaking proficiency (ability to communicate orally on a topic) Vocabulary (knowledge of thematic terms) Grammar (ability to form structures appropriately in Spanish) Culture (knowledge of and exposure to Hispanic customs/traditions)
